DEPUTATION:

A deputation consisting of Messrs. Thomas D'Arcy,
Martin Beale and Mrs. Kathleen Egan, representing the
residents of the N. B. A. Housing Scheme at Park Avenue,
Gorey, was received by the Meeting and discussed with the
Members the necessity of retaining the wall between
Park Avenue and Allenwood Drive.

The Members confirmed the Council's decision to
prevent the access of vehicular traffic between the two
housing estates and asked for a report on the recent attempt
to remove the wall by the Council employees. They, also,
asked that the existing pedestrian access be examined to
see if any improvement could be effected.

N.B.A. 40 HOUSE SCHEME AT McLEOD'S FIELD, GOREY:

The members were informed that tenders had now been
received by the N.B.A. for the erection of a 40 House
Scheme at McLeod's Field, Gorey. The lowest tender was
submitted by Mr. James Miller, Arklow Road, Gorey, in the
sum of £444,711.97 and the County Manager proposed to
approve of the acceptance of this tender.

The Management of the scheme including architectural,
engineering and general supervision would be provided by the
National Building Agency and would include the service of a
full time Clerk of Works and regular inspection by an
Architect. A fee of 5% to 6% would be payable for these
services.

Subject to the necessary capital monies being avail-
able and the Contractor being successful in his application
for an Insurance Bond it was anticipated that a start could
be made on the construction of the scheme in early September.

The Committee approved of the County Manager's proposal.

LOCAL IMPROVEMENT SCHEMES:


The Committee was informed that the grant allocation for these schemes had been increased to £21,000 for the current year. Having regard to overexpenditure in the previous year an amount of £4,875 was now available to each area. The members confirmed the following schemes which had been selected at the April Meeting.
