ATTENDANCE:

CARRIGFOYLE QUARRY:

The Deputy County Manager outlined supplemental conditions to be attached to the Draft Lease to Roadstone Ltd. and other conditions to be met by the County Council. The supplemental conditions provided for the following:-

1. Dust Suppression;
2. Maximum noise level;
3. Maximum vibration from blastings;
4. Times of blastings;
5. Notice of blastings to be given;
6. Prohibition on Sunday production; and
7. Truck drivers to be instructed to use the approved routes.

The other conditions to be met by the County Council are as follows:-

1. Provision of adequate warning signs;
2. Strengthening and widening of road between Barntown and Fraynes Cross on a phased basis; and
3. Formulation of an overall development plan for Forth Mountain area which would include the quarry (advice to be sought from An Foras Forbartha).

The Committee were informed by Mr. Casey that negotiations to acquire land to carry out access improvement works were in progress between Roadstone and a local "land-owner".

On the proposal of Councillor T. Howlin, seconded by Councillor L. Carthy, it was agreed that the proposed conditions be recommended for approval by the Council.

On confirmation of agreement with Messrs. Roadstone Limited it was agreed on the proposal of Councillor Mrs. A. Doyle, seconded by Councillor L. Carthy, that the Association be informed in writing of the proposed conditions.

ROSSLARE HARBOUR:

The Committee agreed that the next Meeting would take place at 12 noon on 12th September, 1979, in the Hotel, Rosslare at which development proposals of the Rosslare Harbour Development Board would be examined and discussed.

PURCHASE OF LAND:

The Deputy County Manager informed the Meeting of the Council's acquisition of 35 acres of land at Rosslare and the committee recommended that the Council approve of the purchase.

MINUTES:

The Minutes of the last District Committee Meeting were adopted on the proposition of Councillor T. Howlin seconded by Councillor L. Carthy.

ENGINEERS REPORTS:

The Committee considered the report of Mr. W. M. Dunne on Sanitary works in progress and of J. Power on Roadworks. Questions arising from the reports and matters requiring attention were discussed with the engineering staff present.

AMENITY GRANTS:

It was agreed to defer consideration of the making of Amenity Grants to the September Meeting of the District Committee and that the bona fide of the I.S.P.C.A. (Wexford Branch) for such a grant would be clarified.

HOUSING:

The Housing Report submitted to the Meeting was considered and discussed.

WEXFORD GAS COMPANY:

On the proposal of Councillor B. Corish, T.D., seconded by Councillor T. Howlin, it was agreed that the Committee recommend for sympathetic consideration an application from the Wexford Gas Company for contribution towards the capital cost of providing gas supply system to the Townparks Housing Scheme.

PLANNING REFUSALS:

A list of applications for planning permission refused since the last District Committee Meeting was circulated and discussed with Mrs. R. Nixon, Acting Chief Assistant (Planning).

MALICIOUS INJURY CLAIMS:

HOUSING PROJECT - MERNAGH'S FIELD GOREY

The meeting was informed that proposals had been submitted by four Building Contractors in response to public advertisement for the erection of 30 semi detached dwellinghouses at Mernagh's Field, Gorey. The proposal submitted by Mr. James Miller, Arklow Road, Gorey was the most suitable and the County Manager proposed to issue the development licence to this firm.

The Committee agreed with the County Manager's proposal and asked that the work be commenced with the least possible delay.

LETTING OF HOUSES

Following a lengthy discussion the County Managers proposals for the allocation of tenancies for the forty house scheme in Gorey, a vacant house in Coolgreany, and two houses in Ballycanew, were agreed. On the proposal of Deputy Allen seconded by Deputy D'Arcy the Committee recommended that the offer of tenancies to persons who owned their own houses should be conditional on these persons surrendering their houses to the local authority. The Committee asked that this matter be debated at the next meeting of the General Purposes Committee of the Council.

COOLGREANY HOUSING SCHEME


Having considered the County Managers proposals for the allocation of tenancies for the 18 house scheme at Coolgreany the members asked that certain applications be re-examined.
